

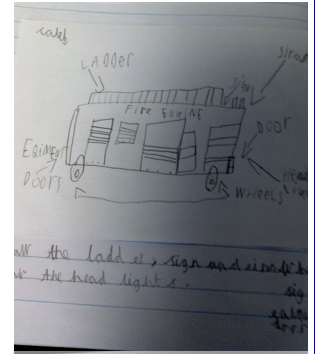
Pancake Day
