Increase no. teams at KS2 Boccia tournament!

Idsall School once again hosted the KS2 Boccia competition on Monday 13th January 2020. In total 21 teams (65pupils) from 10 different partner primary schools took part in the event. Boccia is an attack and defend ball game, originally designed for people with disabilities to play. It is played by two sides competing over a set number of ends, like bowls. The aim is to score as many points as possible by placing their set of coloured balls closest to the white jack ball. The event combined a friendly atmosphere with excitement and competition from all teams. Shifnal B team won the competition with St Johns finishing as runner up and Castlefields coming 3rd. Partnership Development Manager Chris Jew said “the atmosphere in the sports hall was great with all teams competing in the right spirit, regardless of results. Well done to all teams and especially to the fantastic Idsall School leaders who staffed the event”.



Olympic values on show at KS2 Sportshall Athletics !!

A record 26 teams from 13 different partner schools with a total of 174 pupils took part in the Key Stage 2 Sportshall Athletics tournament at William Brookes School on Monday 27th January. The event was officiated by trained sports leaders from WBS who performed their roles extremely well in testing conditions. The standard of performance on show was also very high in both track and field events leading to a very close finish for the overall team places with everyone demonstrating excellent sportsmanship and respect. Winners of the girls competition was Shifnal with St Johns 2nd and Castlefields 3rd Castlefields school took the boys title with St Leonards 2nd and Highley 3rd. Both winning teams will now go forward to represent East Shropshire at the Winter School Games finals Shrewsbury Sports Village on 3rd March.

LEADERSHIP

Another busy half term, not only for our partner primary schools but also for WBS sports leaders as we hosted 4 events in 4 weeks using different leaders for each event to ensure minimum interference in their curriculum lessons. This meant a very busy time for SGCs Annie Smith, Kerry Humphreys and PE Apprentice Jade Jones, arranging to meet and train the 72 leaders involved.

Between January 21st and Feb half term the leaders have enabled over 650 primary children to participate in competitions or festivals at WBS which is a fantastic achievement. All events ran smoothly down to good planning and the leaders being well organised and ready to use their initiative. Mrs Smith has received several emails following each event to say how much the primary children enjoyed themselves and what a positive experience they had. Staff also congratulated the leaders for being kind, friendly, helpful and enthusiastic, as well as being good role models and for their efficient running of each event, ensuring all finished on time.

ESSP INCLUSION FESTIVAL 21st Jan

This was the first time WBS had hosted the Inclusion festival since 2016. 11 schools entered including 6 from our WBS 'family' which was great! The festival is aimed at those children who do not normally represent their school in sport or perhaps lack confidence in social situations. The action took place in the sports hall and outside on the MUGA with the children working in school teams of 8 rotating around 4 outdoor and 4 indoor activities.

The leaders explained and demonstrated each station and the children practiced before doing 3 mins timed when the team had to score as many points as they could. Following the 'catching challenges' station each child took their challenge sheet back to school to see if they could continue practicing and achieve a bronze, silver or gold award. They also took the team score sheet back so they could have another go at some of the activities to see if they could improve their team score.

125 children took part and at the end the 27 leaders involved presented individual certificates to children who had demonstrated the Olympic values of Determination, Courage, Inspiration and Excellence. St Johns won the Spirit of the Games team award for Passion.

ESSP SPORTSHALL ATHLETICS 27th Jan

This year saw 13 schools enter the Sportshall athletics, which is the most we have had. SGC Annie Smith was delighted to see teams from Barrow, Much Wenlock and Broseley enter this year representing our WBS 'family'. With 196 children participating in both track and field events organiser SGO Chris Jew and the 27 leaders had their work cut out to ensure everything ran to time and no children missed their event. Thanks to their training with SGC Kerry Humphreys all the leaders were confident in their ability to officiate their event and the PE apprentices did a great job with results. Competition was fierce on the track and there were some outstanding results in field events but everyone took part in the spirit of good sportsmanship with Highley taking the team award for the School Games Value of Passion. The event winners were Castlefields in the boys and Shifnal in the girls who now go forward to the county finals.

SGCo out and about!

This half term both Mrs Cowburn and Mr Preece have been working in Highley Primary school. Their teaching has been focusing on the 'This Girl Can' campaign where the girls will try a variety of sports to engage and boost their confidence. The Year 5 and 6 girls have covered Body Combat where they learnt some simple combat moves in time with music, Bench Ball where they focused on the rules and tactics to try and beat the opposition and Tri-Golf to focus on accuracy and control.

The Year 1 and 2 girls focused purely on multi-skills. This included fitness where they looked at core movements, core stability and strength, they did this through the game of fitness bingo and the fitness card game! They then focused on throwing and catching where they worked in pairs and then progressed into a big team game where they try to score points. Next, they learnt rolling a ball, where they progressed from performing to working in groups rolling into hoops like golf. It got very competitive!

This half term Oldbury Wells year 10 Young Coaches Academy led an event for year 4 students. They dove deep into a game called bench ball going through throwing, catching, marking, intercepting. WBS DANCE FESTIVAL

Monday 10th Feb saw all 8 schools attend dress rehearsals for the primary dance festival taking place on the evenings of Tue 11th and Wed 12th Feb. WBS dance teacher Jordan Spilsbury and Y13 dance student Molly Southgate decided that for the tenth anniversary of WBS being in the present building the dance festival should have an Olympic theme because WBS is the only Coubertin (Olympic) school in Great Britain. As such each school was given an Olympic value to base their dance on. Molly and Jordan also visited each school with the gold Olympic Torch to film them in rehearsals and allow the children to explain which Olympic value inspired their dance.

The children performed in front of packed houses each evening and it was fantastic to see several schools had produced 2 separate dances for the show. Unfortunately, Barrow were unable attend the evening performances, but their dance was filmed at the dress rehearsal so that it could be shown to audiences in the evenings.



In total 243 primary children took part in the dance festival over the 2 evenings (4 schools performing each evening) alongside 60 WBS students. Annie Smith wishes to extend her thanks to all the primary staff who remain backstage throughout the evenings trying to keep very excited children calm and composed and ready for their moment in the spotlight.

Special thanks to Molly Southgate who choreographed and taught Church Preen and Buildwas their dances as well as supporting Barrow, She also produced the programme and running order, as well as teaching the Y7 WBS dance group and performing 2 dances in the show herself.
