

On 5th March the East Shropshire School Sport Partnership narrowly lost out to Shrewsbury, North Shropshire T&W Burton Borough at the 2019 Winter/spring Shropshire Homes School Sport Festival as part of the School Games. In total over 131 pupils took part in 10 different team events from 19 different partnership primary schools against 5 other partnership areas—Shrewsbury, South Shropshire, North Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin Burton Borough and Telford & Wrekin Langley. All East Shropshire teams participated magnificently. Overall results were as follows: Y5/6 Basketball 6th, KS2 X Country 2nd, Y3/4 Gymnastics (A team) 2nd (B-team) 1st, High 5 Netball 6th, Quicksticks Hockey 1st Small Schools Tag Rugby 6th, Large Schools Tag Rugby 1st, Sportshall Athletics 4th (girls) 5th (boys), Sportsability Sportshall 5th. Combined scores from all events meant East Shropshire came 4th overall. The whole event was also supported by 44 KS3/4 students from East Shropshire acting as officials, event managers and team managers. one of these, Will Perkins from WBS was also presented with an award for one of only 2 most valuable leaders of the day!!



Curriculum Time

The Year 5 and 6 students at Castlefields Primary School took part in a some fitness sessions delivered by Mrs Cowburn. The students were taught the 'Tabata' style interval training which is a type of training which consists of a high intensity exercise followed by frequent but short rests. They did a variety of different exercises at each station. They then went on to learn about cardiovascular endurance, muscular endurance and what a circuit and stations are. Later in the half term these students were also faced with trust and communication challeng-



es to prepare them ready for an orienteering event which the children attended at William Brookes Schoo They were able to untangle themselves from a human knot and guide their partner who is blind folded through an obstacle course via verbal communication and trust.

Year 3 and 4 participated in some team building activities this term which consisted of co-operating as a team to be able to solve problems that may have been put in front of them by listening to each other. The students also learnt how to read a map of their schools grounds and understand the symbols that are used on the map. They then went on to put what they had learnt into action by creating their own map from a drawing.

Year 1 and 2 were with Miss Hartland this term learning about multi-skills and alternate ways of travelling.



The children completed a multi-skills circuit which had been set up for them including different equipment so that the students were having to complete the circuit via different methods of travelling. Some of these activities included using additional equipment such as balls to dribble however, the majority of the stations consisted of using their imagination to come up with different ways of moving around or through the objects. Some of the methods that the children had chosen varied from the crab, to crawling across the floor to bunny hops and skipping.
