
Secondary Competition Results 2018 – 19



On Tuesday 2nd July the 'Green Army' took to Shrewsbury Sports Village in a bid to win back the School Games Champions spot from the Shrewsbury area following the winter games in March. 18 teams from 11 partnership schools competed in 11 different competitions ranging from traditional summer sports such as rounders, golf and tennis and alternative sports such as Boccia, New Age Kurling and Cycling. The key stage 2 pupils from all teams and schools performed magnificently on the day and through their combined efforts managed to once again claim top spot for the East Shropshire area for the 9th time out of 12 attempts!!

The event was also supported by 43 sports leaders from Idsall, Oldbury Wells and William Brookes schools acting as officials and team managers across orienteering, dodgeball, rounders and other sports.

Overall results were as follows: Archery—East 2nd, Boccia—East 5th, Cycling—East 1st, Dodgeball—East 2nd, Mini-Tennis—East 4th, Kurling—East 1st, Orienteering—East 2nd, Rounders—East 4th, Small School Rounders—East 2nd, Tri-Golf Y3/4—East 1st, Tri-Golf Y5/6—East 2nd, Sportsability Cricket—East 4th. Combined points = 54, defeating Shrewsbury (47) by 7 points!



Young Coaches Academy organise final event of the year!








| Primary school support
