Your very first job you need to do is to decide what toy you are going to be making!

You might like use some ideas from things we have been learning in class or you might like to look around your home for your favourite toys for ideas! You could think about why they are your favourite too!

You might like to go on a scavenger hunt around your home for some materials that you could use!

Your recycling might be a great place to start!

You could ask relatives if they have materials that they could donate to you.

You could use our class learning of materials to help you to think about why you have chosen the materials that you have chosen.

For example, is it because you need your toy to be hard or soft? Do you need it to bend?

















In Cedar class our topic is toys! Our home project for this term is going to be to create our own toy! This is be a very open task and you can choose the type of toy you would like to make!

Your challenge is to only use things that you have in your home already! This poster will give you some suggestions about how your project could develop over the weeks, and these could be shared with me as they progress on Tapestry!

You could write a list of the materials that you have used! We will be learning about materials as part of our science work in school. You will be able to use this to help you!

If you are making an older toy, you might like to talk to your parents or grandparents about toys that they used to play with when they were little. They might be able to tell you about some interesting toys that you have not heard about before!

You can evaluate your toys! You could think about your favourite parts of the toy that you have made, and the bits that you enjoyed making. You might even discuss some ideas about things that you might like to change if you were to create another toy!
