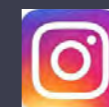

Competition in the curriculum!!

Throughout autumn term 2 the team of School Games Coordinators have delivered a specially designed Covid-19 safe Netball scheme of work to KS2. Schools have either opted for Y3/4 classes or Y5/6 classes or in some cases both! Pupils have been learning the basics of passing, receiving, shooting, dodging and creating space! Results from all schools will then be compared against each other in family groups and also sent to the county Active Partnership - 'Energize' to compare results against other schools across the county towards a virtual level 2 competition. 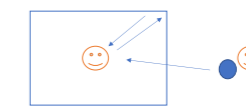
4. Final fun – reactor ball and receiving on the move



A. How to set up
 • 2 pupils with 1 ball stand 2-3m apart, and in space away from other pairs.

B. How to play
 1 pupil has the ball the other needs to receive the ball and pass back. The ball needs to be passed in different ways such as a bounce, low pass, high pass etc. pupils do 30 passes then swap the role. See image above

2. Using the 2-3m square from activity 3, 1 player with the ball stands 2m outside the square, the player inside the square moves to each corner and quickly changes direction to return to the centre to receive a pass.



C. How to include & challenge all pupils

Make it harder
more challenging passes, high and low with more speed

WBS FAMILY -AUTUMN 2 NEWSLETTER FROM SGO ANNIE SMITH

Well done everyone for such a great effort keeping things going during this strange and at times difficult term. Despite the continued restrictions and limitations due to Covid, schools have managed to keep so many children active and involved in competitions. SGO Annie Smith and PE Apprentice Dan Searle have enjoyed teaching in Brockton, Buildwas, Much Wenlock and Church Preen this half term delivering netball with Yr5/6, agility/balance/coordination with Yr 1/2 and catching / throwing with Yr 3/4.

5 WBS primary schools have been involved in the ESSP Netball Challenges. The Challenges were aimed mostly at Yr5/6 although Barrow yr3/4s also gave them a go. There were 4 challenges – two were skill/technique based, the 3 pass challenge and the 60 second shoot out. The sprint and receive and speed drill challenges were focussed on agility and ‘fast feet’. 144 children took part from Much Wenlock, Broseley, Buildwas, Church Preen and Barrow. The top 3 performers in each school will be awarded certificates to recognise their achievements. Well done to everyone who went outside no matter what the weather was like and worked hard to master each challenge and keep improving their scores, you all showed great resilience and determination.

Yr3/4 children from Brockton and Buildwas took part in the WBS Catching challenges, which aim to improve hand-eye coordination. The 30 children taking part had to complete 4 of the challenges to gain a Bronze award, 8 to gain a Silver and all 12 to gain a gold award. After 4 weeks of working hard developing their catching skills – 14 Golds, 11 Silvers and 3 Bronze were awarded. Well done to all the children who persevered even when they found some of the challenges difficult but mastered them in the end.

On Friday 11th December, our ‘family’ of schools had a super day when all 7 took part in the WBS Primary Schools **SANTA X-Country DASH**. Similar Santa Dashes were taking place all around the UK on the same day. An amazing 904 children from Reception to Yr6 took part. The Santa Dashes were organised by yr6 Bronze Ambassadors following training with SGO Annie Smith. The BAs had to plan the routes and mark them out, organise the times that each separate class would run, print out certificates and design results sheets for class teachers to fill in and return to the BAs so that certificates could be written and presented. Children were encouraged to wear something red or Christmassy and run in wellies (as Santa wears wellies) if conditions allowed. The collage of photos shows some of the colourful outfits and different year groups who took part and you can see how much they enjoyed the day.

The BAs had to adapt depending on the course conditions on the day. Brockton leaders changed theirs from a race up the muddy Brockton hill to a personal challenge to see how many laps each child could do after setting them off individually. Every child exceeded their target with some yr1/2 children completing 5 laps and some yr6 boys completing 10 – amazing!

Much Wenlock BAs cut a route through the wooded area to make the course more challenging and even organised hot chocolate for all the runners when they finished!

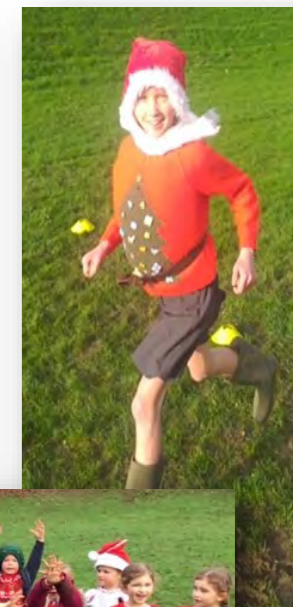

Athletics competition through the curriculum!

This half-term Mr Jew has been working with the OWS family of schools covering delivering netball in all 5 schools and Active Play Through Storytelling in 2 schools. Mr Jew has been working with Y3/4 and Reception again at Highley, Y3 and 4 at Castlefields, Y5 and Y2 at St Marys Bluecoat, Y5/6 and Y3/4 at Claverley and Y3/4 and 5/6 at Alveley.

Pupils have been learning all aspects of netball from passing, receiving, shooting, dodging, marking and working in small teams in game type games. Results from all teaching will be used to compare against other schools in the family to form a virtual inter-school competition. Results from certain events such as 'Reactor Ball', 'Sprint and Receive' and 'Agility Passing' will also be sent to the county's Active Partnership—'Energize' to be entered into a county wide virtual competition for Y3/4 or 5/6! This means that pupils across the area will have taken part in a class competition, OWS family competition and county competition once again!!

This half term I have visited all four of our family schools each week. Whilst in **Shifnal** I met with 8 Bronze Ambassadors each week to develop leadership skills and train them to organise and run a dodgeball house competition for their classes; the BA's took their roles seriously and performed very well running 3 successful competitions! The Year 5's took part in Netball (high 5) focusing on the specific skills and rules to improve their performances, the class were a delight to teach and had outstanding levels of effort and sportsmanship. In the final week at Shifnal pupils from years 6, 5 and 1 / 2 took part in an elf hunt and Christmas orienteering event, during which the pupils showed excellent enthusiasm and determination.

I also organised an elf orienteering session in which every child in the school took part, even the nursery children! It was delightful to see the effort made by all with lovely smiles on their faces.

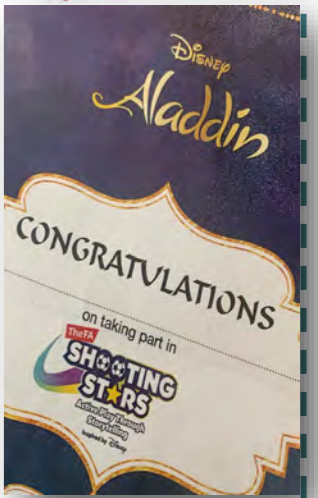

It's been a delight to work with Mr Walford and the Year 3/4 and 5/6s focusing on Netball. We have developed an understanding of directional games and in particular Invasion games. Working on a range of skills related to Netball, like sending and receiving, movement and supporting the ball carrier. In addition, we looked at being fair and the importance of rules and why they are important in games.

Worfield

Another enjoyable term working with Mrs Dipple's class and Mrs Merrick's class. Mrs Dipple's class focused on the Guardians of the Galaxy module improving their tactical understanding of directional games. Developing their understanding of rules and how they keep players safe. They have followed commands to help them prepare for instructions from staff. They have explored the basics of tactics and how to work as part of a team towards a shared goal. How to evade opponents and the skills required to outwit them.
