The EYFS children made a special set of rocks about Hansel and Gretel to use as a trail around the village and lots of our friends followed it!



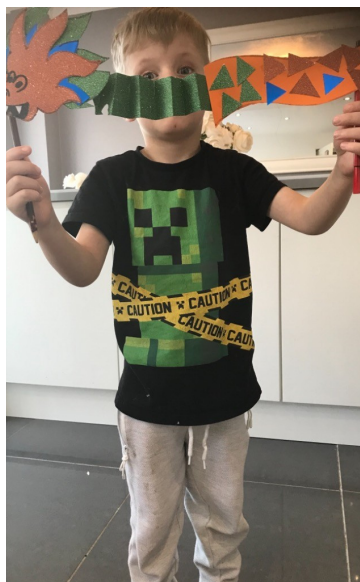
WELL DONE FROM MR. O'MALLEY AND MISS COLEMAN

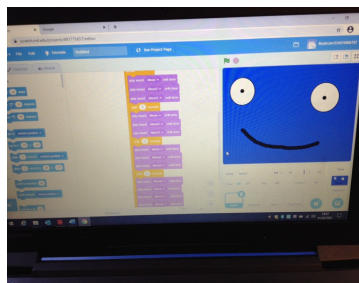
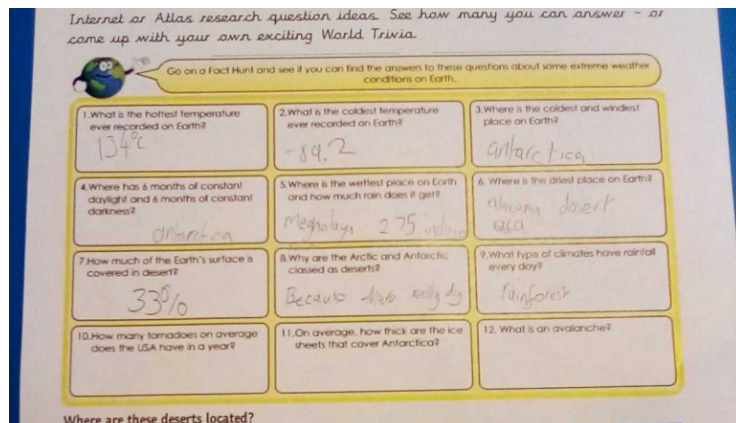
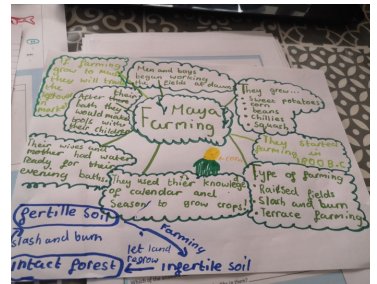
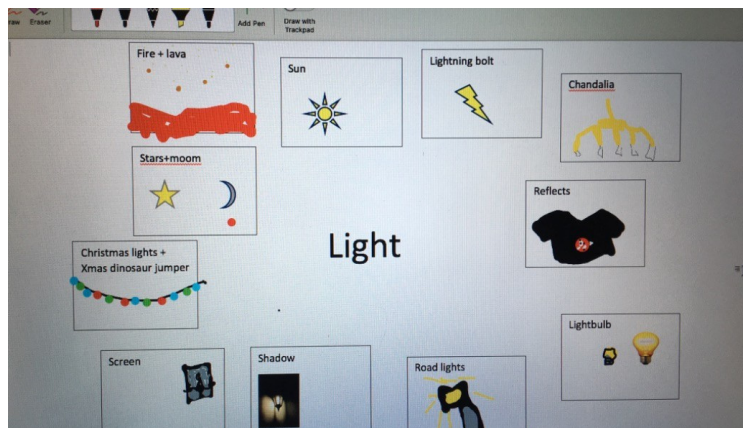
CEDAR CLASS
