# CLASSES




#### **BEECH**

#### **OUR CURRENT LEARNING**

To end the Summer Term in Nursery, we made our own minibeasts and took them on a journey to the seaside, which we built ourselves in the classroom, and to the local park. This was linked to the stories 'What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside' and 'The Snail and the Whale', which we have really enjoyed sharing. We used knowledge from our own journeys to make maps which could lead us from one place to another, incorporating the use of positional language. We have discussed the transition that some of the children will be making to Reception class and have lots of ideas of how our learning will continue as we move on throughout the school.





#### JOIN OUR NURSERY!

In EYFS at Alveley School, we follow a child led approach to play based learning with the belief that each child develops at his or her own pace. The teachers and teaching assistants support each child's development, focusing upon interests and taking opportunities to support and extend learning in a meaningful context. Play is a child's work, we follow their personal exploration and natural inquisitiveness to extend and develop learning opportunities.

A positive ethos is at the heart of our EYFS unit. It is extremely important that the children feel happy and comfortable within the setting; where they are constantly supported and encouraged. The children's achievements are recognised and celebrated. This ethos allows for and encourages problem solving, resilience, curiosity and high levels of engagement. All adults recognise the importance of developing a strong, positive, trusting relationship with each child, knowing each of them as an individual. # FOREST SCHOOL

#### OUR CURRENT FOREST SCHOOL LEARNING-LIFE CYCLES

Children have been discussing the life cycles of plants, insects and animals as part of their Forest School learning this month. Children looked at plants growing within the Science Garden to analyse how they grow and adapt. They looked at how the plants eventually grew big enough to become produce. To replicate a plant life cycle, the children found natural resources and laid them out to show how the plants grew and changed over time.

The children used a similar process when considering the life cycles of insects and birds. They considered the habitat with which the creature lived and how they grow over time. Using roleplay, the children showed the different elements of the life cycles.

Within 'Little Squirrels' Nursery and Beech Class, children have explored the life cycles of caterpillars to butterflies. The children have watched and investigated caterpillars in a special growing kit, where they will then keep an eye on them until they are ready to be set free as butterflies.







#### **OUR FIRST CROP!**

All children were excited to learn that their growing efforts had resulted in cucumbers that were ripe enough to be picked! Children were able to sample the food they had grown as the cucumbers were shared between classes for taste testing. It created a real hubbub in school as all children were excited to realise their growing efforts from the seeds they had planted, to the plants they had nurtured had resulted in such a great crop. Many commented on the fresh smell and delicious taste of the cucumbers. We are so proud of the children and their teamwork to produce the crops they have now had the joy of eating, all part of the 'Farm to Fork' initiative.
