CLASSES



BEECH

Our topic this first half term was" Guess Who"- all about ourselves. We looked at our features by drawing our faces, making clay 3D faces and talking about them and we created crazy hair pictures showing all the different types of hair people have. We read stories which explored our emotions and ideas about people all being different and celebrating their differences.



CEDAR

Cedar Class have had a fantastic first half term back. All the children have settled back in well. Our topic for this half term was 'Our World.' Children enjoyed dressing up for our topic day and learnt about where they are in relation to the world. Children got messy and made papier mache globes and learnt about the names of the different continents and where they are located.

The class also took a trip to the Severn Valley Country Park. The weather was on our side and allowed us to have an action packed day. Children took part in pond dipping, looking for stickleback fish and pond snails to name a few.



ELM

Elm Class have travelled back in time to the Stone Age! We have enjoyed learning about how their lifestyle and looking at how it has changed over time. In our art lessons we looked at prehistoric cave paintings, we then got to create our own prehistoric paint which we used to paint our own cave paintings! Elm visited the Shropshire Hills Discovery Centre in Craven Arms and took part in Stone Age and Iron Age activities. We had a great day and got up to lots such as preparing for a hunt, spear throwing, Celtic face painting and we even saw the most complete mammoth skeleton in the whole of Britain!



OAK

This term in Oak it has been action-packed. We have been focusing on the 'Vicious Vikings'. We have enjoyed learning about how they were traders, raiders and how they came to settle in England. On Topic Day,, we designed and created dragon eyes using clay. We learnt about Viking weapons and designed our own shield. In the afternoon, we worked in a group to create catapults then tested them by firing marshmallows and measuring how far they travelled.

OUR LEARNING

Each day, children have adult led activities, including a daily phonics lesson delivered to all children. Following their adult led learning, children work with a teacher to complete scaffolded activities. While some children are completing work with their teacher, others engage in child initiated learning, supported by other adults. To maximise learning opportunities, children have daily access to both an indoor and outdoor classroom, where independence and choice are encouraged. All areas of the EYFS framework, including reading, writing and mathematics are planned coherently across all ages and activities and opportunities are appropriately adapted to meet each child's needs, deepening and extending their understanding. Within the carefully planned environment, stimulus and enhanced provision is used to excite, capture and motivate the children and provide learning opportunities.





JOIN OUR NURSERY!

A positive ethos is at the heart of our EYFS unit. It is extremely important that the children feel happy and comfortable within the setting; where they are constantly supported and encouraged. The children's achievements are recognised and celebrated. This ethos allows for and encourages problem solving, resilience, curiosity and high levels of engagement. Here are some examples of questions you could ask while reading. These will help with reading comprehension knowledge and deepen understanding of what has been read.

Vocabulary Draw upon knowledge of vocabulary in order to understand the text.	Infer Make inferences from the text.
