Reading and home learning



This half term our class are going to be...

Writers (Literacy): This term we will be reading our class books 'Darwin's Dragons' and 'Moth'. We will be writing letters, character descriptions and poetry.
Mathematicians (Maths): We will be moving onto fractions. First we will focus on equivalents and move on to adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions.
