Impact Statement of Sports Premium Funding by R Smith

Sport delivered at Alveley Primary School summary

- 1. PE delivery in school provides children with two hours of timetabled Physical Education per week.
- 2. During break times Sports Premium funded TA oversaw play leader school games.
- 3. Friday afternoon local community tennis providers targeting change for life group.
- 4. Termly community sports links through: Bridgnorth leisure centre swimming, Rising Stars cricket and Kidderminster Harriers football club.
- 5. School games mark achieved: Silver Award

Sports Premium Teaching Assistant (TA) sport leader IMPACT

- Running of a lunchtime clubs run by 12 UKS2 children and supervised by sports premium coach. Lunch time games including a mixture of individual balance, movement and ball games delivered to 20 children.
- 2. 45 KS2 children continuing the weekly mile, participation register to show children doing more than just two hours of curriculum physical activity during the school week.
- 3. TA organised and upskilled play leaders to run and record the weekly mile diary.
- 4. TA attended sports partnership events to lead the children.

East Shropshire PE and Schools Sport Partnership IMPACT

- 1. To fund transport to Sports Partnership events to facilitate participation. The school entered 12 events, over 7 different sports with over 40 children attending (an aggregate of over 100 children participating).
- 1b. Transport funded to transport children to the sports events.
- 2. Professional Development 3 days for sports premium TA to attend sports partnership training.
- 3. The school won two team fair play awards, achieved semi-finals in rounders.
- 3b. Two children represented the school at county cross countries and one child represented the school at the swimming gala.
- 4. OWS PE teacher taught lesson structure CPD to teachers at the school to whole school.
- 4b. OWS teacher ran intra school tournament and upskilled sports ambassadors.

New sports equipment IMPACT

- 1. New gym tables for KS2 children to participate in gymnastics has improved the quality of PE lessons observed this year.
- 2. Gym mat trolley to ensure all children can access equipment and organise their own learning spaces.
- 3. New football goal for KS1 playground so children can access appropriate size.

3b. New basketball ball hops and cricket rapid fire rebound net for KS1 children to access a range of multisport activities.

Playground Development IMPACT – too early to review

- 1. New equipment ordered for playground to be installed Summer 2019.
- 2. Children will have alternative activities to football or hockey goals daily.
- 3. Children to have access to climbing and balancing equipment.

Action taken to rectify barriers to future sustainability.

- 1. Staff funding: Designated sports TA to attend events and keep PE coordinator in the classroom.
- 2. Transport costs: collaboration within the academy trust to use shared minibuses.
- 3. Professional development: Paid teacher professional development from the East Shropshire Sports Partnership and the school supported the Sports TA on NVQ, carrying out lesson observations and supporting paperwork.
