
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THE KING'S CORONATION CELEBRATIONS

In classes, children discussed the meaning of the coronation and what may happen over the Coronation Bank Holiday weekend; as well as what they may do to celebrate too. During lunch, the children enjoyed a picnic with their peers before celebrating the Coronation with monarch inspired activities within their class.

All classes have helped to decorate collaged crowns, with some having decorated the fencing around the school site over the bank holiday weekend. Children within EYFS celebrated with a tea party, whilst others such as Elm class played 'Pin the Crown on King Charles', before participating in a Scavenger Hunt for Royal themed items. CLASSES



BEECH

Reception have been looking at the concept of more and less in number work. They have compared piles of objects with each other using the language more, less and the same. They have looked at consecutive numbers on the number line to see what is 'one more' and 'one less' than a particular number. The children called these the 'friends' of that number.



ELM

Elm class arrived in class to a very big surprise- their chairs had all decided to go on strike! There were lots of thoughtful ideas linked to the topic 'Mayans', ranging from a waste of resources to make the chairs, through to the idea Mayans may just not have needed them. The children needed to persuade the Mayan God, Kukulcan, to return their chairs using their very best persuasive writing techniques.



CEDAR

In Cedar class, the children have learnt about amphibians and reptiles in their science lessons. They have discussed the differences and what the clear features are of both groups. The children participated in a scavenger hunt in our outdoor space, where they looked for creatures. Cedar class then worked in groups to categorise the creatures into their correct groups.



OAK

Oak have been learning about World War II and how Britain was rebuilt post war. They have looked at how people stayed safe in bomb shelters. The class explored different artefacts and discussed why British people wanted significant changes after the war eg. the Welfare State and Nationalisation.

The children's achievements are recognised and celebrated. This ethos allows for and encourages problem solving, resilience, curiosity and high levels of engagement. All classes have had a range of seeds that they have discussed before choosing the ideal planting condition and hoping that they see the results of their planting support very soon with a flourish of growth around the site- we are hoping for a lovely Summer to promote this!

Children have also supported and participated with the ongoing renovation of Forest School, using wheelbarrows to move soil to the large planters and assisting with smaller level project workwe thank them for their own commitment and passion to the project! They have all shown great enthusiasm to working together as a team, really showing the Alveley Primary spirit and true resilience to get the jobs done, their work has been a huge help to the wider scale work that is being undertaken!





ONGOING FOREST SCHOOL RENOVATION UPDATES!
