# CLASSES



### **BEECH**

During the first half of the Summer Term Reception have enjoyed learning all about the Ocean. We have visited the Great Barrier Reef on Google Earth and looked at different sea creatures and corals. We have learnt how we can help to look after the Ocean and keep the sea creatures safe by cleaning up and recycling. In literacy we have written descriptions of sea creatures, created a poster to encourage people to save the Ocean and written about our favourite parts of focus stories.

Maths lessons have been based around number up to 20 and using shape to compose pictures.

We have enjoyed many stories based around our topic, enjoyed practising for Sports Day in our PE sessions and had a great parent workshop!



## **ELM**

This half term has gone very fast in Elm, we have gotten up to lots! We have been writing explanation texts on Ancient Maya. In science we have been learning about our digestive system and our teeth, we even did an investigation on what drink is the best for our teeth! In PE we have had lots of fun with Alveley Cricket Club this half term developing our fielding and striking skills. With Mr Bennett we have been improving our athletic techniques getting ready for sports day! Elm have learnt all about the Ancient Maya, looking at Pok-ta-Pok, inventions and the cacao beans.



#### **CEDAR**

This half term in Cedar Class they have been learning about the topic- Medieval Magic. In History children have been learning about what is a monarchy. Children have been reading a variety of fiction and non-fictions books based on castle and the monarchy in guided reading. In Literacy children have written a story setting description of a castle and have re-wrote their own narrative on the traditional tale, The Princess and The Pea. In maths children have been learning about money and fractions. In Science children have enjoyed learning about what plants need to grow and have planted their own sweet peas. In music children have enjoyed repeating and creating their own rhythmic patterns linked to the story, George and The Dragon. In PSHE, children have learnt about money. Children have enjoyed developing their computing skills by exploring spreadsheets.

We're so proud of Year 6's fantastic attitude during SATs and celebrated with treats, including an ice cream van visit and a fun canoeing trip from Alveley to Arley. ## JOIN OUR NURSERY!

Each day, children have adult led activities, including a daily phonics lesson delivered to all children. Following their adult led learning, children work with a teacher to complete scaffolded activities. While some children are completing work with their teacher, others engage in child initiated learning, supported by other adults.

To maximise learning opportunities, children have daily access to both an indoor and outdoor classroom, where independence and choice are encouraged. All areas of the EYFS framework, including reading, writing and mathematics are planned coherently across all ages and activities and opportunities are appropriately adapted to meet each child's needs, deepening and extending their understanding. Within the carefully planned environment, stimulus and enhanced provision is used to excite, capture and motivate the children and provide learning opportunities.
