OUR LEARNING

BEECH CLASS



This half term in Beech Class, our learning has focused on winter and winter celebrations, exploring the season and the different ways it is celebrated. A highlight of the term was our phonics workshop, which was a great success. Parents had the opportunity to see a phonics lesson in action and then support their child with follow-up learning activities at home. This half term we have enjoyed a variety of focus books and adventures, including *Room on the Broom*, *The Story of Guy Fawkes*, *Wacky Races*, *The Gingerbread Man*, and *the Nativity Story*. These stories have inspired creativity, discussion, and role-play in class. During Forest School, the children have been taking part in team-building exercises and observing the changing seasons, developing both their social skills and their understanding of the natural world. Overall, it has been a wonderful and engaging half term filled with learning, exploration, and festive fun!

CEDAR CLASS



During Autumn 2, Cedar Class have had a fun-filled and busy half term, packed with creativity, learning and festive excitement! Our main topic focused on Superheroes, where we explored what it really means to be a hero. We talked about real-life superheroes, such as people who help others in our community, and discussed the qualities that make someone brave, kind and helpful. This linked closely to our writing, where the children worked hard to create their own non-chronological reports, showcasing their growing confidence as writers.

We were delighted to welcome parents into school for a workshop, where children and adults worked together to create giant spiders out of newspaper. This was a fantastic opportunity to be creative, work collaboratively and share learning together — and the results were brilliant!

As the festive season approached, Cedar Class enjoyed decorating for Christmas and getting into the Christmas spirit. A huge part of our half term has been practising for the Nativity, where the children showed wonderful enthusiasm, confidence and teamwork. They should be very proud of their effort

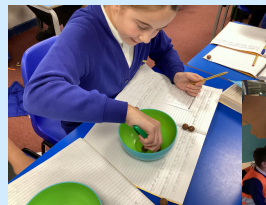
ELM CLASS



This term has been busy and exciting in Elm class! Our topic this half term has been 'Escape from Pompeii'. We have enjoyed learning about volcanoes and rocks as well as what happened in Pompeii. During our parent workshop afternoon, we enjoyed planning and making volcanoes with our families. The best part was experimenting and making the volcanoes erupt, some more than once! As well as learning about our topic we have also been preparing for the Christmas Nativity at the church! The children have worked really hard on singing the songs for KS1's Nativity performance and they did an incredible job!

The children have explored calypso music this half term with Mrs Dyche, we have listened to different pieces and worked together as a class to create and sing our own! We even recognised some of the music out of the movie *Paddington*! In literacy we have wrote a newspaper report on the Sainsbury's Christmas advert and a set of instructions on how to steal Christmas!

OAK CLASS



Oak Class had an action-packed term! They enjoyed learning about Charles Darwin and evolution, particularly investigating Darwin's finches and completing a science investigation. The pupils also took part in a successful parent workshop, where they planned and built bridges alongside their families.

Oak Class pupils had a brilliant time at Thinktank in Birmingham. In the morning, they explored chemical reactions in the laboratory, becoming real scientists. The group made carbon dioxide using a vinegar reaction and created slime from borax and clear glue. All pupils enjoyed exploring the hands-on experiences around the museum.

The class had been getting into the Christmas mood, practising the Christmas songs, and the choir attended the Oldbury Wells Trust event, where they performed fantastically.

The Parenting Team will also be delivering free SLEEP TIGHT groups from January 2026

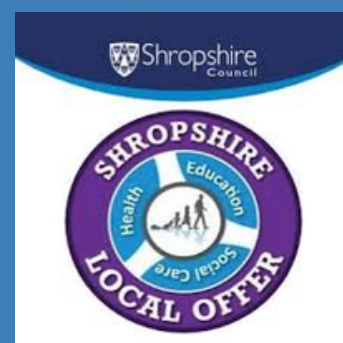
These 5 week workshops cover:
