**Forest – Wed** Again, please ensure full kit (including waterproofs and wellies) are in school on that day. Also make sure you child has long sleeves.

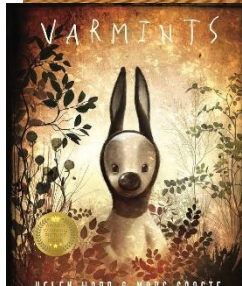
